The video explains that “rebuilt” compressors, on the other hand, typically reuse any functional parts even if they may be sub-par.

The video also cites the UL seal of approval as a method of comparing compressors. All Genuine Carlyle remanufactured compressors are produced to these internationally recognized safety standards. In contrast, the video demonstrates that few rebuilt compressors meet UL safety levels, thus risking code violations and potentially invalidating the original UL listing for the entire system.
